**Text:** Titus 3:3-7

1. **Icebreaker:** Can you share about a time when you experienced a dramatic "before and after" moment (e.g., in a relationship, job, or personal growth)?
2. Read Titus 3:3. What stands out to you about the description of our lives before Christ? How do you see this reflected in the world today?
3. Paul includes himself by saying "we ourselves were once..." (v. 3). Why do you think it's important to remember our past condition when sharing the Gospel?
4. In verses 4–5, Paul contrasts our sinful state with God's goodness and mercy. What does this tell us about God's character and His view of us?
5. Verse 5 says we are saved "not because of works done by us in righteousness." Why is it crucial to understand that salvation is based on God's mercy, not our efforts?
6. What does it mean to be "washed by the regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit" (v. 5)? How have you experienced this in your life?
7. Verse 7 speaks about being "justified by grace." How does this truth shape your identity and your relationship with God?
8. How does remembering the "bad news" of our former state motivate us to appreciate the "good news" of salvation?
9. In light of verses 6–7, what does it mean for you to live as an heir of eternal life? How should this shape your daily actions and attitudes?
10. Who in your life might still be living in "volume 1" (the bad news)? How can you lovingly share "volume 2" (the good news) with them?
