Introduction: What kind of leader would it take to bring peace—not just between nations, but within the human heart?

God's Glory in Salvation through Judgment (Isaiah 1-12)

I. The Reign (11:1-9)

- A shoot from the stump of Jesse—the Messiah, Jesus—rises from ruin.
- The Spirit of the Lord rests on Him: wisdom, counsel, might, knowledge, and the fear of the Lord.
- His rule is marked by righteousness, justice, and faithfulness.
- Even creation is renewed: "The wolf shall dwell with the lamb."

Firmly Planted, Growing Together, Made to Multiply

II. The Regathering (11:10–16)

- The *Root of Jesse* stands as a signal to the nations; God gathers His people home.
- Old hostilities end; division gives way to unity and peace.
- A new "exodus" points to Christ's global redemption.

Apply:

Let Jesus heal broken relationships.

Join His mission of reconciliation—inviting others home to Him.

III. The Response of Praise (12:1–6)

- God's anger has turned away; comfort and salvation have come.
- Joy overflows—His people sing and make His deeds known to all nations.

Apply:

Remember and rejoice—your salvation is secure. Let gratitude lead to worship and witness.

This is your hope.

Main Idea:

Only the Spirit-anointed Messiah can bring lasting peace—through His righteous reign, His regathering of His people, and their joyful response of praise.

"Peace will never come through politics, prosperity, or persuasion. It will come through a Person—Jesus Christ."

Isaiah Memory Verse:

"There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit." (Isaiah 11:1, ESV)
