- **Icebreaker:** Where in your life do you most often feel a lack of peace—home, work, relationships, or internally? (cf. Isaiah 26:3; John 14:27)
- When you think about global peace negotiations today, why do you think peace is so hard to achieve—even when everyone says they want it? (cf. James 4:1–2)
- In what ways do people reject the peace God offers, even when it's clearly presented? (cf. Isaiah 53:1–3; John 1:10–11)
- Why do you think people in Isaiah's time—and still today—struggle to recognize God's peace when it comes through someone humble and unattractive by worldly standards? (cf. Isaiah 53:2–3; 1 Samuel 16:7)
- Which phrase from Isaiah 53:4–6 stands out to you most ("carried our sorrows," "pierced for our transgressions," etc.), and why? What does it reveal about the cost of our peace? (cf. Isaiah 53:5; Romans 5:1)
- What is the significance of the Servant remaining silent while suffering, and how does this shape your understanding of Jesus' willing sacrifice? (cf. Isaiah 53:7; Matthew 26:63; 1 Peter 2:23)
- How would you explain the "great exchange"—Christ taking our sin and giving us His righteousness—to someone who's never heard it before? (cf. Isaiah 53:10–12; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
