- 1. What stood out to you most in Isaiah 58, and why do you think God speaks so strongly to His people in this chapter?
- 2. In what ways can religious activity (church attendance, serving, fasting, reading) become disconnected from God's heart for justice?

 Where does this temptation show up in your own life?
- 3. Isaiah 58 shows people who appear very spiritual—but God is not pleased with their worship.

Why does God reject worship that ignores justice and compassion?

4. "The fast God chooses" involves loosening bonds, removing burdens, sharing bread, welcoming the vulnerable.

Which one of these feels most natural to you? Which feels most challenging?

5. How does the church today sometimes emphasize Truth at the expense of Mercy, or Justice at the expense of Peace?

Where do you personally tend to lean?

- 6. In the skit, Truth, Mercy, Justice, and Peace express fears about being misused or manipulated. Which of their insights resonated with you most, and why?
- 7. God promises that when His people pursue justice, they become "repairers of broken walls" and "restorers of streets."

What might that look like in your community, workplace, or family?

- 8. Why is it impossible to do biblical justice well without the gospel at the center? How does the cross bring Truth, Mercy, Justice, and Peace together?
- 9. What obstacles keep believers from engaging in the kind of justice Isaiah 58 describes—fear, busyness, politics, comfort, or discouragement?

 How can we overcome these?
- 10. What is one practical step your small group (or each person individually) can take this month to "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God" in a way that reflects Jesus?
