In 1999, Chuck Colson wrote that “We live in a culture that is at best morally indifferent. A culture in which Judeo-Christian values are mocked and where immorality in high places is not only ignored but even rewarded in the voting booth. A culture in which violence, banality, meanness, and disintegrating personal behavior are destroying civility and endangering the very life of our communities...weary, we are tempted to withdraw into the safety of our sanctuaries, to keep busy by plugging into every program offered by our megachurches, hoping to keep ourselves and our children safe from the coming desolation.”

Years later, the conflict has only intensified. It was out of this concern that the Colson Fellows Program was born. Who among us isn't concerned that our culture is rapidly abandoning its philosophical moorings and the distinctively Christian ideas that have contributed to both the propagation of the Christian faith and unprecedented human flourishing? Suffice it to say, our culture is abandoning truth in favor of ideas that always and everywhere do harm to the human person and society.

The Colson Fellows Program: A Formative Journey for Faithful Living

The Colson Fellows Program is a formative journey designed to shape how Christians see the world and live faithfully within it. While many educational settings rightly emphasize performance—demonstrating mastery through papers, exams, and credentials—the Colson Fellows Program is intentionally oriented toward formation: being shaped by what is true so that one's loves, practices, and convictions are increasingly ordered toward Christ and His Kingdom.

This is not a retreat from rigor, but a different kind of rigor. The aim is not merely to prove what one knows, but to be transformed by the truth of the Christian faith. The program seeks the spiritual formation of the whole person by deepening and clarifying theological understanding and practice, forming men and women whose lives are shaped by the reality of Christ's reign.

The journey unfolds through a carefully curated curriculum built around four theological pillars—Truth, Hope, Identity, and Calling. Together, these pillars trace the Christian story and guide participants from a renewed understanding of reality to faithful, embodied obedience in everyday life.

Through daily devotionals, curated readings, and learning alongside fellow believers and trusted faculty from across the country, participants are formed to think Christianly, live faithfully, and steward their influence with wisdom, humility, and courage.

TRUTH: The Christian Story and the Nature of Reality

Recover the Christian worldview by tracing the full biblical story—Creation, Fall, Redemption, and Restoration—and discover how it makes sense of the world as it truly is. Participants learn to contrast the Christian vision of reality with rival worldviews and reclaim the gospel of the Kingdom as God's redemptive work for all of creation.

HOPE: The Christian Confidence in a Disordered Age

Cultivate a resilient Christian hope rooted in four unshakable realities: Christ is risen, Christ is Lord, Christ is making all things new, and Christ has placed us here and now for His purposes.

IDENTITY: The Imago Dei and the Meaning of Personhood

Reclaim a biblical understanding of what it means to be human by grounding identity in the doctrine of the imago Dei and addressing cultural distortions that redefine humanity as self-constructed rather than created.

CALLING: Living Faithfully Under Christ's Lordship


Integrate belief and practice by learning to live out the Christian faith publicly and faithfully in every sphere of life—family, church, work, and society—through intentional formation, discernment, and action.

Each phase of the program develops according to a primary focus

All course components and activities are designed to explain, develop, and sharpen that focus in the program participants. The topics for each phase frame the primary elements of the focus and guide the various learning activities of the phase.


Course Components

The Colson Fellows Program is designed to walk alongside participants as they grow in wisdom, faithfulness, and discernment over the course of the year. Through a rhythm of reading, prayer, discussion, and practice, participants are guided into deeper reflection on the Christian faith and its meaning for everyday life. Learning takes place in community, where questions are welcomed, insights are shared, and faith is strengthened through thoughtful discussion and mutual encouragement. Each element of the program is ordered toward helping participants attend more faithfully to God's truth, live with greater hope, understand themselves more clearly, and respond obediently to Christ's calling in the world.



DAILY DEVOTIONALS (MONDAY - FRIDAY)

Daily devotionals provide a scriptural thread weaving together the course components as students study the full-orbed story of the Bible—Creation, Fall, Redemption, and Restoration—and its implications for Truth, Hope, Identity, and Calling.



READING & DISCUSSION

Students read 12-14 books throughout the Program, along with a selection of articles and essays, **organized to support each phase of formation**. Monthly meetings allow students to discuss and process what they're reading with their fellow students and leaders.



VIDEOS

Cutting-edge videos serve as resources for discussion and teaching. The videos are intended to convey information as well as model approach, tone and attitude. Students are encouraged to pay close attention to what is said and how the speakers present their positions and respond to questions.



WEBINARS

Twice a month, students engage with leading Christian scholars and practitioners via webinar. Many of these leaders are the authors of books that the students are reading. Interacting with these leaders in real time deepens the experience with the most current ideas.




WORLDVIEW TEACHING PRACTICUM & PERSONAL MISSION PLAN

Students facilitate a four-part Christian worldview study (provided by the Colson Center), sharing what they have learned. The Personal Mission Plan aids students in discerning their particular calling within God's redemptive story, helping them identify next steps toward living under the Lordship of Christ in their family, church, work, and wider culture.



MONTHLY MEETINGS

Students meet each month to review and discuss what they are learning with their fellow students and leaders to process what they're learning in a friendly, energetic setting.



COLSON CENTER NATIONAL CONFERENCE

The Colson Center National Conference is the climactic event of the year, featuring a stunning line-up of renowned speakers and the Colson Fellows commissioning ceremony. It also offers times to connect with other dynamic men and women who are changing cities, industries, and mission fields. Registration and travel costs are not included as part of tuition.
